



A microchip is a rice grain-sized passive radio frequency identification device (RFID), that is quickly and painlessly inserted under your pet's skin, tagged with a unique 15-digit code readable by microchip scanners.



It is implanted in a dog and therefore ensures a unique identification number for each dog. Information about the pet could be stored in a central registry against the assigned identification number, which includes information about the pet owner and the pet's health status.



Benefits of Microchipping

- Microchipping is the fastest way to identify lost pets and get them home safe and sound.
- While collars and tags can get removed, a microchip identifies your pet permanently and effectively.
- Microchipped dogs are more than twice as likely to be returned to their owner compared to non-microchipped pets.
- A microchip can make all the difference when it comes to getting your pet back home.

DID YOU KNOW?

When a microchipped pet isn't reunited with the owner, it's usually due to incorrect or missing owner information in the pet registration database system. Therefore, it is very important to provide your correct contact details during the registration and update on a regular basis.



While having the microchip implanted is an important step, it's equally important that you update your information upon:

- Change of ownership
- Death of your pet
- Loss of your pet
- Change in address
- Annual renewal
- Vaccination
